Theme: Digital in Education

Welcome to the 2024 Erasmus+ Cluster and Contact-Making meeting, part of the Regional Erasmus+ Week for Sub-Saharan Africa!

This event, brought to you by the Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture (DG EAC) of the European Commission and the European Education and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA), will take place in Abidjan (Côte d'Ivoire) on 26 and 27 June 2024 and on the RingCentral-Hopin virtual platform.

The event aims at gathering Higher Education and Vocational Education and Training institutions from Sub-Saharan Africa and Europe active in the Erasmus+ programme or potentially interested in developing cooperation under this scheme. As participants, you will be joined by stakeholders from both regions involved in the implementation and promotion of the Erasmus+ programme such as the African Erasmus+ National Focal Points, Erasmus+ National Agencies, European Union Delegations in Africa, the European Commission and the European Education and Culture Executive Agency.

This year's thematic focus is Digital in Education.

Rapid digitalisation over the past decade has transformed many aspects of work and daily life. Driven by innovation and technological evolution, the digital transformation is reshaping society, the labour market and the future of work.

The education and training system is increasingly part of the digital transformation and can harness its benefits and opportunities. However, it also needs to effectively manage the risks of the digital transformation, including the risk of a digital divide where certain people – or regions – can benefit more than others, and prepare for the rapid deployment of Artificial Intelligence. The digital transformation in education is being driven by advances in connectivity; the widespread use of devices and digital applications; the need for individual flexibility and the ever-increasing demand for digital skills.

We have learned much from the COVID-19 crisis, which has heavily impacted education and training and accelerated dig-

ital change. In addition, African societies facing a high demographic pressure, see digitalisation as a means to expand access to education.

In line with the strategic priorities of the European Digital Education Action Plan (2021-2027), the Erasmus+ programme can play a key role in supporting citizens of all ages in acquiring the digital skills and competences they need to live, learn, work, exercise their rights, be informed, access online services, communicate, critically consume, create and disseminate digital education content.

Finally, the Erasmus+ programme is part of and contributes to the Global Gateway Africa – Europe Investment Package. In this context, the event will focus on the necessary articulation of two of the Global Gateway main objectives, namely "Accelerating the digital transition" and "Improving education and training".

Participants will engage in discussions on digital education and its impact on shaping the future of learning:

- Erasmus+ Cluster Meeting and Contact Making (26-27 June) The cluster meeting on the 26th and 27th June aims to support cooperation between African and European education actors, discussing the experience of Erasmus+ beneficiaries and inspiring potential newcomers. In doing so, the event will address the overall meeting theme of Digital in Education.
- Half-day contact-making session (27 June). The contact-making session aims at fostering potential further cooperation between African and European stakeholders. Facilitated exercises will enable participants to meet and engage with each other, with a view to forming project partnerships. The online and in situ participants will take part in different activities, designed to make best use of their physical or online situations.

Doing that will facilitate live, 1-on-1 video chats. When this area is open, click on the "Ready" button and you will be randomly connected to another attendee.
	<b>Intentional Networking:</b> We highly recommend you use RingCentral-Hopin's bilateral contact-making feature which allows you to directly message others and request for a meeting. You can search for specific individuals or profiles based on interests, then reach out to arrange one-on-one meetings.
